Antifreeze Disposal Policy

Due to new and more stringent federal and state regulations for environmental protection and the District's requirements for industrial pollutants entering the wastewater treatment plant, the following procedures must be strictly followed for the draining and flushing of radiators:

Commercial/Industrial Discharger: Fluid (antifreeze) drained from radiators shall not be discharged into the sanitary sewer or the storm drain system (gutters, storm drains, or creeks). Instead the fluid drained from the radiator shall be captured for recycling, or disposed of by a certified waste hauler. Subsequent flushing of the radiator with fresh water must be collected and recycled/reused as well. Fluid from a radiator that has been in a boil-out or a test tank shall not be discharged into the sanitary sewer system.



Individual Residents: Residents are encouraged not to drain and flush their radiators at home. However, residents who drain radiators from their own cars can bring their antifreeze to a participating commercial establishment, such as an auto repair shop or parts supplier. Residents can also collect and bring the antifreeze to the Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility located at 889 A Devlin road, American Canyon. This facility is open year-round.
