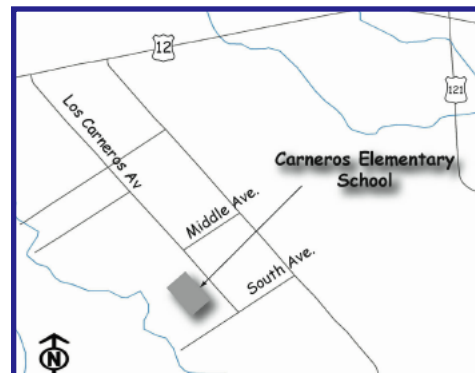

Ed Weber is the Viticulture Farm Advisor from the University of California Cooperative Extension, Napa County. He is one of six authors of the Suitability Study and will highlight the Study's findings. The findings focus on a comparison of NSD recycled water quality with known vineyard threshold values. In addition, the quality of NSD recycled water was compared to the quality of existing irrigation sources, and soil samples were analyzed from a vineyard irrigated solely with NSD water for eight years.
